Mapping Menstrual Products: Providing Students with Knowledge to Access Essential Resources





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Introduction

- College expenses such as tuition, groceries, and rent, can make menstrual products unaffordable for students³
- A lack of access to menstrual products can lead to absenteeism and impairs students' right to an equitable access to education⁵
- Colleges, including UT Austin, provide menstrual products including pads and tampons which often go unused due to a lack of awareness
- This led to the Student Health Advisory Committee (SHAC) producing a menstrual product map that helps students locate pads and tampons

Student in need of menstrual products

Accesses menstrual product map on any device

Student travels to nearest building on campus to locate hygiene product

Methods

SHAC reached out to building managers at UT Austin to collect information about the availability and location of menstrual products.

Using this knowledge, members created an interactive map using Google Maps, pinpointing buildings on campus that provide menstrual products.

To increase awareness about the map, SHAC:


- Displayed a Digi Screen in common spaces across campus with the QR Code and information about the map
